Example of combustible cladding / ACPs

- widely used for over 30 years
- first recorded fire also 30 years ago
- first Australian investigations back in 2010
- practice and regulation started to change after Lacrosse (2014) and Grenfell (2017)

ELEMENT 1

NCC evidence of suitability

ACTIONS

Amend the NCC evidence of suitability provisions (Part A5) to:

- increase rigour
- set minimum and consistent information requirements
- include directions on appropriate evidence pathway for the product and application

OUTCOME

NCC's evidence of suitability provisions are used consistently and appropriately to deliver sufficiently detailed and rigorous information to allow for a product's appropriate selection and use.

ELEMENT 2

Information obligations for manufacturers and suppliers

ACTIONS

- Require minimum product information from manufacturers and suppliers
- Develop industry conformance schemes
- Affordable Australian standards

OUTCOMES

- Clear, accurate, current and verified information available for all building products to inform compliant selection and installation.
- Consistency and familiarity in the presentation of information facilitates efficient and reliable selection.

ELEMENT 3

Product traceability & identification

ACTIONS

- standards for construction industry traceability
- product labelling requirements in all NCC referenced standards

OUTCOMES

- share reliable and trusted information across supply chain
- certainty products specified / ordered are the ones delivered to site
- transparency on global knowledge of product's performance
- up to date information in the event of problems over the life of the building

ELEMENT 4

Surveillance,
research &
information
sharing

ACTIONS

- oversight of product assurance system
- review building product standards
- central information portal
- conformance and compliance guide

OUTCOMES

- reduce the length of time required to identify problem products / inappropriate use of products
- when necessary, changes to regulation and practice occur quickly
- improved understanding as to how to navigate building product supply and demand

ELEMENT 5

Strengthen audit and enforcement

ACTIONS

- audit and enforcement powers in each state and territory
- extend compliance to building product supply
- target information omissions, misrepresentation and fraud
- enforcement action is well communicated

OUTCOMES

- strengthen enforcement
- increase transparency
